Each year, elections for Trails Club board positions offer an opportunity for an infusion of new ideas and leadership. This year we will elect a new President, Treasurer, Lodge Trustee, Social Trustee and Membership Trustee at the annual meeting on November 9, 2009.

Each term lasts two years, giving the board members a chance to grasp and engage in the business of our organization. The vacancies are staggered so half the board members are continuing into their second year when new board members assume their positions. The board meets on the second Tuesday of every month at 7 p.m. for 1½ hours.

When a Nominations Committee member approaches you to be a candidate for one of the upcoming vacancies, don't automatically decline. Please consider how you can serve your club. Many members are concerned that they don't have enough knowledge of the organization, but not many of the offices require it. Serving on the board is an excellent way to learn about the operation of the Trails Club. The board positions mainly require mature judgment, leadership and common sense.

Most of the work of the Trails Club occurs at the committee level. The Trustees provide the conduit for information flow between the committees and the board. This function is crucial to the smooth operation of the club as the board makes wide-ranging policy and budget decisions.

Primary duties of the positions are:

President – presides at all meetings of the club and board; serves as ex-officio member of all committees; has general supervision of all the affairs of the club.

Treasurer – keeps faithful records of the club's accounts; provides all records necessary for the preparation of annual tax returns; makes monthly reports of the club's financial condition.

Lodges Trustee – chairs Lodges and Properties Committee which supervises the maintenance and use of the lodges and their grounds; oversees two subcommittees for Tyee and Nesika.

Membership Trustee – chairs Membership Committee which promotes interest in membership; receives all applications for membership and notifies applicants of their election to membership.

Social Trustee – chairs the Social Committee which plans and conducts all entertainment programs and other social functions sponsored by the club.

Summary of Board Minutes

TRAILS CLUB OF OREGON BOARD OF TRUSTEES
Meeting Summary June 9, 2009

Call to Order—Susan called the meeting to order at 7 pm.

Approval of Minutes—The May 2009 minutes were approved with the correction of two “typos” (msc Audrey, Barbara).

Administrative Assistant’s Report—No report.

Treasurer’s Report--Audrey Perino presented June’s report:

Beginning balance	\$4,658.88
May deposits	1,884.53
May checks	<u>- 3,596.12</u>
Ending balance 5/31/09	\$2,947.29

Membership income is on target, but Tyee lodge fees continue to be below budget, in part due to bad weather at Christmas time. Publication expenses are higher than both the budget to date and compared to this time last year. TCO received a federal tax refund of \$7,363.42, which continues to delay the need for an infusion from the investment account.

COMMITTEES

Membership—Vicki Wood presented four new applications for first reading. Kitty Tsoi was voted in as a new member.

Trips—The Board discussed Susan’s “Safety Should Be Our Top Priority in Any Trails Club Activity” article, which has been provided to all activity leaders.

Publications—Reasons for being over budget were discussed. Phil Jackson noted that the Blazer has included an extra page three months running.

Social—Callista Snively reported that 40 people participated in the Memorial Day Hike n’ Dine at Nesika. She reported on upcoming events: June 18, summer picnic; June 20, Hike n’ Dine at Tyee, including June Smelser’s

90th birthday celebration; and July 30, summer picnic (postponed from July 16).

Lodges—Dave Conrad reported that the Tyee roof needs to be repaired before next winter. Susan Saul had also asked for a key to Tyee, which was approved by the Board.

Audrey Perino presented an idea for increasing usage of Tyee and Nesika by not requiring hosts to cook. Hosts would have to take reservations ahead of time and collect fees at the lodges. Outside groups could also use the lodges as long as they are “guests” of a club member. Dave will provide Susan with an email list of members with keys as a first recruitment strategy. Barbara Warren-Sams will coordinate requests and inform Web master and Blazer editor. Susan will write an announcement for the Blazer and develop a standard description for the Blazer so that hosts don’t have to write one.

Stephen Brown reported in detail on roof problem at Tyee. Because of the metal roof, snow had slid into the roof seams over the dining room and caused bulging in two “valley” areas. He will check on the roof warranty, contact a contractor/roofer familiar with high-snowload experience and receive an estimated cost of repairs.

History—Susan Saul has asked the Oregon Historical Society to return TCO materials so that all materials will be stored at the Mazamas. OHS is reviewing the request and will get back to her.

Investment and Conservation—No reports.

New Business—Susan mentioned the need to make nominating committee appointments as soon as possible. She also reported that she has talked with the Forest Service about service projects that TCO can perform to lower the permit fee for Tyee.

Adjournment—The meeting was adjourned at 8:37 pm.
