BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING
December 08, 2009**

Call to Order – Susan called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm.

Approval of Minutes – November 2009 Minutes were approved (msc Vicki/Callista).

Administrative Assistant’s Report – Virginia Larson submitted her monthly report. The Administrative Assistant’s hours will be reduced in 2010 to 10 hrs/wk.

Treasurer’s Report – Audrey Perino reported that \$13,000 was transferred from the investment accounts. Total cost of Tye roof: \$55,448.72.

Audrey reminded the Board that signature card changes must be made with Morgan Stanley, Columbia Management & US Bank due to new Board appointments. There was confusion regarding when receipts are necessary for reimbursements. The Board reaffirmed the policy that receipts are required for reimbursement.

Committees - Membership – Vicki Wood reported that there are 10 new membership applications for 1st Reading and 1 membership was confirmed.

Trips – Jane Storey reported that the Mileage Awards forms will be on the web for 2009 claims – Members should fill out the forms for hiking, PCT & bicycle. First Aid Training was held at Rosevilla of November 14. First Aid items will be offered for sale to members. Jane stated that there is need for bicycle chairperson. She also raised concerns regarding the planning & scheduling of outings. The Board reaffirmed the policy that all outings need to be approved by the Board. It was agreed that the policies and procedures would be reviewed and updated.

Publications – Phil Jackson reported that Barbara Warren-Sams will become Asst Blazer Editor.

Social – Callista Snively reported that Lila Grossman had 16 people at Tye over Thanksgiving. She also stated that the next Adventures and Travel is scheduled Jan 28 regarding Viet Nam. The Board agreed to the change the banquet from April 11 to March 28, 2010.

Lodges and Properties – George Milne reported that concerns have been raised regarding lodge rates, supplies and meals. George requests that these types of issues, as well as activities should be addressed by the Lodges Committee.

History – Susan reported that June Smelser has resigned. She also has not heard from Historical Society regarding return of materials stored there – she will follow up. She noted that there are some old films in the archives which TCO should convert into dvd’s.

Investment – Audrey discussed the status of the cash account. She noted that an additional \$13,000 was transferred for club operations last month.

Conservation – A draft letter to City of Portland regarding use of trails in Forest Park by bikes was submitted to Susan for consideration. Susan suggested that it not be submitted at this time.

Legal Counsel Report - Art Stangell noted that TCO received a refund from the Forest Service regarding **Tyee**. There were discussions regarding payment of \$600 to Forest Service in 2000 or 2001 on behalf of Paul Sawyer for a bench at Multnomah Falls. At this time TCO is unable to find records of the check but is still searching the records.

Unfinished Business – Carla Haake was approved as Memorials Committee Chair (msc George/Audrey). Carla Haake and Joyce Rasmussen were approved as the signors on the Memorial Endowment Account held by Columbia Management (msc Barbara/Jane).

Budget Committee Report – The 2010 budget was presented by Audrey and adopted by the Board (msc George/Barbara).

New Business - Board Meeting date change – Mazamas has requested that we change our monthly meeting date due to scheduling conflicts on the second Tuesday. The Board agreed to move the meeting to the first Tuesday of the month beginning on Jan 5, 2010.

Class A –Shorter, less strenuous activity,
Class B –Longer miles, more elevation gain,
Class C –Long and difficult – strong experienced participants only. Harsh or unusual conditions may greatly increase the exertion and skill required.

Please be prepared for level of the hike you are planning to take with the Trails Club.

Good walking shoes or boots are required on the trail.

Boots are recommended for B/C hikes.

Bring plenty of water and a sack lunch. Please, no alcohol.

Pets allowed on designated trips only.

Everybody should stay with the group and follow the hike leader. The hike leader is responsible for the group's safety. The hike leader is responsible for determining trails to be taken. Last, but not least, the leader has authority to determine if a hiker is prepared for the hike. Group safety must come first.

If you have reserved for an activity at a lodge that involves food expense and are unable to participate you are obligated to do one of the following: cancel before the food is purchased, find someone to take your place, or pay for your share of the food.

All activities must be approved by the appropriate Activity Chair.
